(We normally begin planning in January.) As a result, we quickly scrambled when health guidelines changed and put on a trimmed down version of the program. Last year, we took the important step forward by opening the "Choristers" group back up for our younger students. KSCI is unlike anything else in the midwest, and we hope to continue to grow.

Each year it is our intent to recruit the best young talent in the area as well as the best Artists and Educators to come together for this one of a kind event.

Each of the clinicians select their own program to create a special experience for the students.

Great care is taken to make sure that this event remains financially accessible to ALL students that have the passion and the talent. Tuition is kept very low due to the help of our donors, scholarship patrons, advertisers and sponsors.





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

Meet the Conductors

Andrew Crane, Andrew Crane joined the BYU faculty in 2015, where his main duties include conducting the Brigham Young University Singers and teaching courses in the graduate conducting curriculum. Previous to this appointment, he served for four years as Director of Choral Activities at East Carolina University, and six years in the same position at California State University, San Bernardino. He is also the former choral director at Provo High School. Choirs under his direction have appeared by invitation at numerous state, regional, and national conferences of the American Choral Directors Association, National Association for Music Education, and National Collegiate Choral Organization. Recent examples include the 2022 ACDA Western Division conference in Long Beach, CA, the 2019 ACDA national conference in Kansas City, MO, the 2020 ACDA Western Division conference in Salt Lake City, UT, and the 2017 NCCO national conference in Baton Rouge, LA.

In May 2022 Dr. Crane led the BYU Singers to multiple first place prizes at the 22nd International Stasys Šimkus Choir Competition (Klaipėda, Lithuania), including the Grand Amber award for best choir; as well as first place in the Mixed Choir division and overall Grand Prix winners in the 2020 International Youth Choir Festival "Aegis Carminis" (Koper, Slovenia). In 2015, he conducted the East Carolina University Chamber Singers to first place honors at the 13th Maribor (Slovenia) International Choral Competition Gallus, and in 2012 the same ensemble, under his direction, was named winner of The American Prize in Choral Performance, College/University Division. Additionally, Crane enjoys a part-time career as a professional ensemble tenor, having appeared with such groups as Seraphic Fire, Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Yale Choral Artists, Spire Chamber Ensemble, Carnegie Hall Festival Chorus, and many others. As a soloist, he has performed the tenor roles in much of the standard concert repertoire for chorus and orchestra. Active as a conductor of honor choirs, clinician, adjudicator and presenter, Crane also serves as immediate Past President of Utah ACDA, and recently completed a four-year term on the national ACDA Standing Committee for Composition Initiatives. In addition, Crane curates a choral series under his name through Walton Music. He and his wife Casandria (also a BYU alumna) reside in American Fork, UT and are the parents of four children.

Blake Richter is a middle school choir director in his hometown of Nixa, Missouri. Blake holds a Doctorate of Educational Leadership, Curriculum, and Instruction from Evangel University, a Masters of Science in Educational Administration, and a Bachelor of Music Education from Missouri State University, where he studied with Dr. Guy B. Webb and Dr. Cameron F. LaBarr.

Blake directs over 300 seventh and eighth grade students in his various ensembles at Nixa Junior High. Blake's choirs have been selected to perform at the Missouri Music Educators Association Conference three times. Blake also serves as the Vocal Director for the Nixa High School Theatre Department. In 2017, Blake was named one of Missouri's 32 Regional Teachers of the Year, in 2019, Blake was awarded the Prelude Award from the Missouri Choral Directors Association for demonstrating exemplary work as a young choral professional, in 2020, Blake was named a Semifinalist for the GRAMMY Music Educator Award, and in 2022, Blake was selected as a member of the Springfield Business Journal's class of 40 Under 40.

In his spare time, Blake runs his Blake Richter Productions business which specializes in video production, audio engineering, and music composition. Blake uses his passion for videography to create fun, engaging videos for his students and the school district. His videos have most recently received awards including the 2019 Missouri School wide Positive Behavior Support Video of the Year, 2017 National PBIS Film of the Year, and have been recognized by The Tonight Show Starring Jimmy Fallon.

Blake lives in Nixa with his wife, Kaitlyn. He counts it a privilege to teach in the district that helped him become the person he is today. He is thankful for the opportunity to have a lasting impact on students' lives through joining together in music making.

Chris Munce is a highly regarded choir director, conductor, and educator in the choral music community. He has worked with a variety of choirs, from youth ensembles to professional groups, and is currently the director of Kantorei KC, a professional choir based in Kansas City. Munce has also been a choral director at Lee's Summit High School for 18 years, where he has made a significant impact on the school's music program.

In addition to his work as a choral director, Munce is the host of the Choralosophy podcast, which explores the art and science of choral music. The podcast has been the world's top rated choir podcast for over four years and is among the world's top Performing Arts podcasts. Through the podcast, Munce has shared his expertise and insights with a wide audience and has become a sought-after clinician and speaker. Munce holds a Master of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music and Dance and has presented at conferences and workshops across the country. His dedication to excellence in choral music, his passion for innovation and collaboration, and his commitment to education and mentorship make him a valuable leader and contributor to the choral community. Media reviews of his directed recordings with Kantorei KC include praise from the KC Star for "Music and Sweet Poetry" for its "lush and full bodied sound...gorgeous singing." The Observer (London) called "To Bethlehem" one of the best Choral albums of the year and "the most interesting festive album." He has also performed with the Simon Carrington Chamber Singers, and the Grammy Winning Kansas City Chorale. Chris was fortunate to be a part of the Chorale's Grammy Nominated album, "Rheinberger: Sacred Choral Works." Chris received a Bachelor's of Music Education and a Master's Degree in Choral Conducting from the UMKC Conservatory of Music and Dance.
